TOPIC DAYS/HALF-DAYS

Giving your visit a context

If you have a particular topic you wish to study we will tailor the sessions to suit. Here are some examples:

Mediaeval/Tudor Life

This will focus on the Abbey as a resource, and use the buildings to stimulate understanding of the period, e.g. Abbey building patterns Stained glass windows Monk's/nun's day Tile making Tudor Life Treasure box Tudor schoolroom

Second World War

We will give your pupils some of the flavour of life on the Home Front during this period, e.g. Make Do & Mend Dig For Victory Air Raid Precaution Wartime cookery Evacuation

Victorians

This can be adapted to suit Houses and Homes, and the Local Area, as well as Britain since the 1930's, e.g. The village shop Box decoration activity Rag rug making Cottage cheese making Washday Domestic object handling The cottage

Fenland Life

Explore different aspects of this unique way of life, e.g. Fenland handling Fenland crafts Farming Fenland cottage Fenland monster

Waste Tells a Story

A new, two-centre, collaboration with Ameycespa waste plant. Look at attitudes towards waste and recycling in the past and today. Perfect for the Eco award.

Farming

Looking at the process of making food using items in the collection, e.g. Farm machinery Farming processes Bread making Farmworker's cottage Farming tools

OUTREACH

Bringing the museum to you

If making a visit to the museum is difficult then outreach is an option. Sessions can be taught in your own classroom by museum staff, and require almost no setting-up time or special arrangements.

Object handling is an opportunity for children to get their hands on history. Seeing, touching and smelling artefacts brings history to life and helps provide an understanding of what it was like to live in the past. Sessions also look at the history behind the objects, and encourage children to make deductions about the people who owned them and the societies in which they lived.
